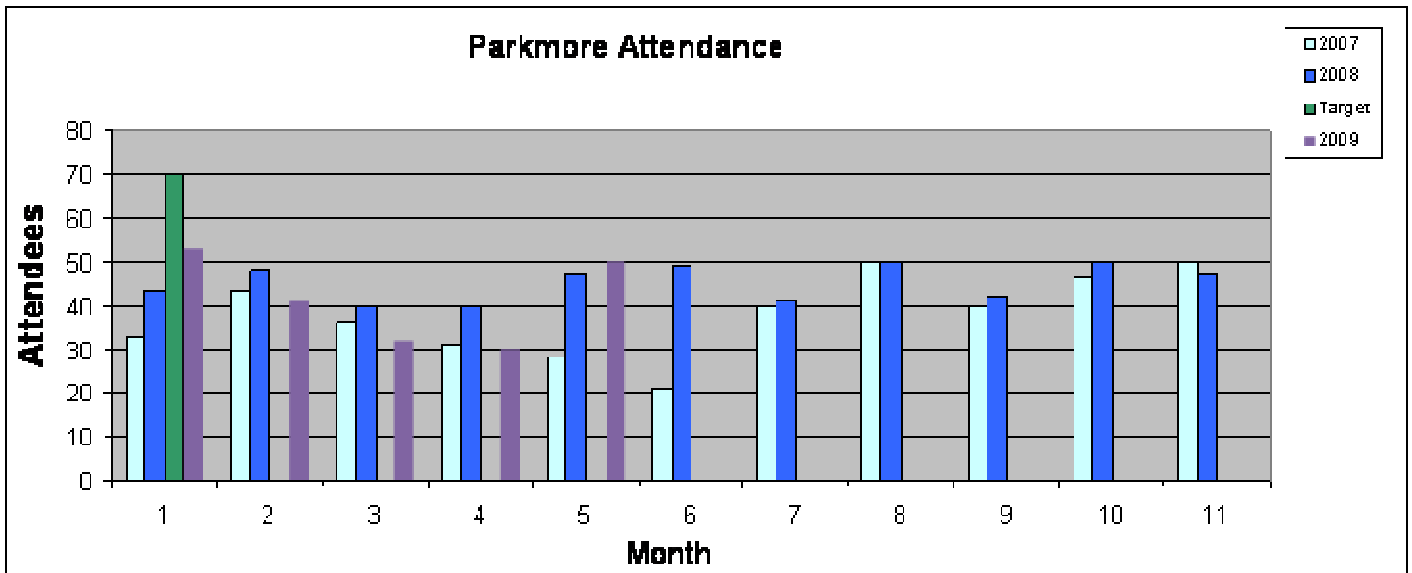


# PARKMORE DOMESTIC WATCH

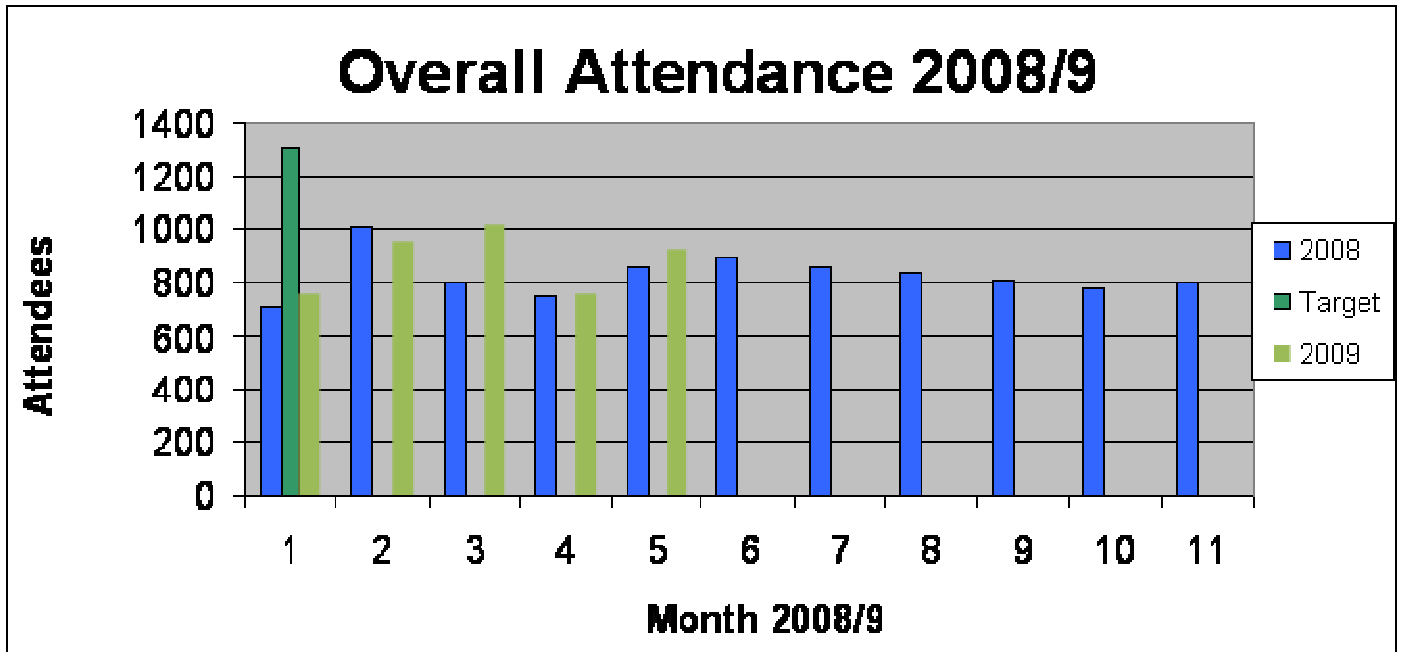
Hi All,
