STREET BLOCK CAPTAINS

The 40 Parkmore residents who volunteered to be 'Block Captains' are now ready to begin their visits.

You may remember this project was initiated out of the April community meeting to establish contact with each and every property owner. This will allow residents to express their views to the PCA and Parkmore as a suburb. It will also facilitate more direct and two-way communication between the PCA and residents.

The Block Captains have copies of the PCA booklet titled "About Parkmore" which highlights our suburb and its possibilities. We would appreciate your feedback when you receive a copy.

PLEASE STOP TRIGGERING FALSE ALARM ACTIVATIONS

It creates unnecessary work focus and reduces our effectiveness.

Analysis of Parkmore house alarm activations received by security companies during a month, shows that 80% of call-outs are triggered by 20% of properties. PCG recorded in excess of 900 activations last month.

For a PCG vehicle to respond to 10-16 calls for a single property is depriving security attention for panic activations and genuine risk incidents. We ask property owners to please have their security equipment checked, and activate the alarm only for real security risk concerns.

BE AWARE!

Protea Coin sent a SMS to all PCA-PCG members on Wednesday morning warning of a white Colt bakkie used in an armed house robbery in 14th Street last Thursday evening. The lady of the house, on arriving at her gate, was accosted and robbed by 4 armed b.males. The bakkie had a stepladder on the roof and writing on the vehicle doors - CCTV footage suggest that it was a construction company vehicle.

It is twice now that a similar bakkie-type vehicle has been used in a house robbery.

PLEASE BECOME PART OF THE CRIME TEAM

We can catch these criminals with your assistance. When driving to and from your property, please take note of the vehicles passing you and/or parked on the side of the road. Report the vehicle type, colour and registration number urgently, so the security role players can close the suburb and apprehend these criminals

The PCA, PCG and SAPS Reservists will be conducting random operations (e.g. More than 7 vehicles patrolling), through Parkmore during June-July.

LIQUOR LICENSE HEARING

The Gauteng Department of Economic Development is inviting the numerous objectors of the application for a liquor license to a meeting of the Gauteng Liquor Board next Tuesday.

The liquor license application pertains to the '**Parkmore Tops Liquor Store**', Shop 16, Parkmore Mews, Olympia Ave between 11th and 12th Street Erf 1430 Parkmore where Sandton Video were situated.

This is the next step in the process that started in 2009. The Gauteng Board should have already given a recommendation? We will soon find out why there is another hearing.

The Liquor Board officer, Mr T Madumise indicates that the 200 plus objectors appoint 2-3 persons to represent them as there is limited space in the meeting room. Despite the lateness of the email received yesterday, we are asked to submit names urgently. The residents who attended the 2009 hearing on your behalf, have volunteered to attend on your behalf. The Liquor Board will not be sending out notices by registered post. The PCA has been asked to advise as many objectors as possible.
