Eight schools, one invitational side and three development sides are invited to participate in this amazing event starting on Friday, 30 January.



The teams represented are a mixture of public and private schools. Each team will participate in three day/night games and the top four teams play in the finals, experiencing all the different aspects of the Night Series. Each team is issued with a specific coloured shirt which they play in for the Series. In previous years the guest speakers were invited to speak to the players at the opening and closing ceremonies, so the boys have been treated to the calibre of Ray Jennings, Garnett Kruger, Graham Pollock and a number of the current Protea players.

Through this series we try to give our young up-coming cricketers the exciting experience of playing under lights, the opportunity for the schools and development sides to get together to compete and to build team spirit and sportsmanship. It has also become a great family outing for all our supporters, many of whom do not even have children playing in the event. The event also boasts jumping castles, playstation vans and braais.
