THOSE AROUND US ...

In a constant quest to ensure improving and sustainable conditions in Parkmore, the PCA's has been meeting with the community groups around us and finding that we share many of the same concerns.

BRYANSTON EAST

Russell Kline, chairman of the BECF tells us they have signed 600 property owners out of a 4000 property suburb. BECF have an agreement with Protea Coin Group similar to the PCA. There are 3 dedicated vehicles patrolling, with the SAPS Sector Manager working in their offices.

PARKHURST

'Parksec', championed by Mark Backeberg, has joined with Core security company with one vehicle patrolling the area of 1200 properties at an extra cost of R350 per month on top of the armed response charge, by those 231 out of 1200 property owners who have signed up.

SANDOWN

The CAP system in Strathaven and Sandown generally costs approximately R500 over and above the armed response fees.

PARKVIEW

The ongoing 'SAFEPARKVIEW' project aims to sign up all 1200 residents at a cost of R630 per month per property including armed response. They have three 24/7 vehicles patrolling and the Parkview Police Station in their suburb.

PARKTOWN

Residents are asked to contribute R1000 to fund the Core security project.

PARKMORE

The PCA's mission is to have all approx. 1200 residents signed up with the Protea Coin community policing project at a current cost of R430 per month per property.

We have only 300+ residents signed up (with a further 119 with the PCA).

500 members will give us the 3rd PCG vehicle, 750 for a 4th vehicle, and 1000 for 5 vehicles, plus a dedicated suburb manager.

GEORGE LEA PARK TENDER
