## DRAFT OF SAFE GUARDING OF SWIMMING POOLS BYLAW

The City is inviting public comment from rate payers on the Draft 5 of the above proposed bylaw. The document lays down some fairly draconian conditions for us to have a swimming pool on our properties.

These include registering the pool with CoJ, compulsory registration, erection of enclosure around the pool with child-safe latches, pool cover with fitted floating pool alarm device, and can inspection by CoJ officials with fines against non-conformance.
